About us



We are PEAS. We are a fast growing not-for-profit with the mission to expand access to sustainably delivered quality secondary education across Africa.

For over fifteen years PEAS has built and operated quality secondary schools in under-served communities in Uganda and Zambia. We now have a network of 38 schools across Uganda and Zambia educating over 20,000 marginalised girls and boys. PEAS has strong evidence from several external studies showing that our schools are more equitable, better quality and more cost-effective than comparison schools.

Beyond the PEAS schools, we are doing something that most non-profits talk about but many fail to deliver - we are scaling our impact. Drawing on years of practical experience in last mile communities, we are working hand-in-hand with governments in Uganda, Zambia and Ghana to improve public schools in rural communities. Through our government partner schools, in 2024 we improved education for nearly 200,000 girls and boys beyond PEAS' own schools.

Having beaten our hugely ambitious growth targets, in 2025 we will be developing a new strategy which will continue to focus on growth. We will make PEAS schools the very best in Uganda and Zambia (despite their challenging locations and disadvantaged cohorts of students). We will embed our culture and practices of school improvement in the government system for good, including in Ghana. And we will do more to share our evidence and know-how across the continent and globally. Yes, it is ambitious. Yes, it is exciting. Yes, it will be challenging.

But if ever there was a time for action, **the time is now**. With more young people in Sub-Saharan Africa than ever before and millions out of secondary school, we face a critical moment to invest in their education to unlock their own and the region's full potential.





The Opportunity



We are seeking an exceptional Chief Programmes Officer (CPO) to join our executive leadership team and drive our mission forward. Reporting directly to the CEO, the CPO will play a pivotal role in shaping the future of education for hundreds of thousands of young people across Uganda, Zambia, and Ghana. The CPO is one of 2 people who can deputise for the CEO.

As the CPO, you will be at the forefront of ensuring that PEAS schools deliver on our three pillars: Access, Quality, and Sustainability. You will oversee the performance of our growing network of 38 schools, which serve over 20,000 students annually, ensuring they provide inclusive, high-quality education that equips students with the skills and knowledge they need to lead fulfilling and successful lives after school. You will also be responsible for the successful integration of an outstanding primary school programme, Impact Network, which has recently merged with PEAS.

In addition to overseeing PEAS school network quality, you will lead and strengthen our government partnerships in Uganda, Zambia, and Ghana. Your leadership will be instrumental in scaling our impact by embedding our best practices within government partner schools and the wider education system, thereby fostering long-term, sustainable change that benefits generations to come.

Across all our work you will champion inclusion, gender equity and safeguarding.

A key aspect of your role will involve developing and maintaining strategic funding partnerships with organisations such as FCDO, USAID, and the MasterCard Foundation, as well as various trusts and foundations associated with the International Education Funders Group. You will also cultivate programmatic partnerships with organisations that will help us expand our reach and enhance the educational experience and attainment of the students we serve.

This is a unique opportunity for a visionary leader to make a significant impact on how education is delivered in Africa. If you are passionate about transforming lives through education and have the expertise to drive programme quality and scale innovation, we invite you to join us in reimagining secondary education in Africa.

- Ensure PEAS' country teams are continuously improving our schools. We never stop striving to improve our schools across our three pillars of impact: Access, Quality, Sustainability
 - Access: PEAS schools expand access to education in an inclusive, gender equitable way
 - Quality: PEAS students enjoy an education which unlocks their full potential and sets them up for fulfilling and socially responsible lives
 - Sustainability: PEAS schools run on a financially scalable model, and we deliver great student outcomes at a lower cost-per-child than government to ensure that our approaches are replicable in low-resource settings
- Drive innovation across programme areas. Lean into new opportunities provided by ed-tech and AI

Scale PEAS school improvement practices

- Ensure the strengthening and scale up of our work in government partner schools in Uganda, Zambia and Ghana (we will have over 300 schools in 2025 and this number is set to grow)
- Oversee quality delivery of PEAS school improvement programme in Uganda which is funded by USAID DIV and which is currently undergoing a Randomised Control Trial
- Build on strong existing relationships with government partners at all levels to embed changes for long-term system strengthening

- Play a key role in growth and expansion (including to new geographies) at PEAS by identifying and building strategic partnerships with funders, governments and peer organisations
- Maintain and build new strategic funding partners. Key relationships that you will take on include FCDO, USAID DIV, Hempel Foundation, Mastercard Foundation
- Cultivate new strategic funding partnerships and programme partnerships.
- Governments: support PEAS County Directors to sustain excellent relationships with Ministries of Education in Uganda, Zambia and Ghana and beyond
- Implementing partners: spot opportunities to collaborate for mission and strategy aligned impact

Evidence, thought leadership and external representation

- Lead the research agenda at PEAS to ensure continual programme improvements and contribute to the global evidence base on what works in rural contexts and adolescent and secondary education
- Design and execute PEAS thought leadership strategy in collaboration with the CEO
- Represent PEAS externally and lead our strategy on sector positioning

Team and organizational leadership

- Lead and motivate an extremely high-performing team of education and MEL experts
- Support Country Directors to implement key education and government partnership priorities
- Set the culture, values, pace and strategy for PEAS as a key member of the PEAS executive leadership team


